AOEC Activities

AOEC members in Rhode Island have worked diligently on the ***Green during construction pledge*** which includes key clean air quality protocols in bid and contract specifications for construction projects. This effort has been officially enacted as an ordinance by the Providence City Council and signed by Mayor Taveras in March. IBEW99 and the RI Building Trades council were instrumental in the ordinance being passed. The NIOSH Office of Construction Safety and Health arranged a meeting between Dr John Howard, Director of NIOSH, and Mr Rick Fedrizzi, President and CEO of the US Green Building Council (USGBC). The USGBC indicated it was open to working with NIOSH to find ways to integrate safety and health (S&H) into various LEED credits.

The NIOSH conference, *Eliminating Health and Safety Disparities at Work*, is to be held on September 14 and 15, 2011 in Chicago. The conference is co-sponsored by NIEHS, EPA and OSHA and is hosted by the UIC School of Public Health. The fiscal year 2012 spending bill for **Labor, Health and Human Services, Education, and Related Agencies** which will address both OSHA and NIOSH is currently scheduled for consideration in the appropriations subcommittee on July 26. The bill is not expected to go before the full committee until early August. As you might expect from the name, the majority of the spending in this bill is related to health and human services issues. To quote a friend from AIHA, “The OSHA and NIOSH portions are *petty cash* compared to HHS funding.”

For those of you who want to voice an opinion on the budget issues, your Congressional representatives can be reached through either <http://www.senate.gov/> or <http://www.house.gov/>. Unfortunately, reaching your Congressional representatives is somewhat problematic. E-mails tend to get lost in the huge volumes that are sent daily (think your own e-mail volume and multiply by several factors of 10) and letters sent via USPS still get sent to a special facility to be sterilized thanks to the 2001 anthrax letters. The best option is to call your representatives nearest local office and get a fax number.

Addressing Public Health and Chemical Exposures: An Action Agenda is the final product of the *National Conversation on Public Health and Chemical Exposures*, a collaborative initiative supported by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and the Agency for Toxic Substances and Disease Registry. RESOLVE, a non-profit independent consensus-building organization, facilitated the *National Conversation*.

Drawing from work group deliberations, web dialogues, community conversations and public comment opportunities, the Action Agenda, authored by the *National Conversation Leadership Council*, includes clear, achievable recommendations to help government agencies and other organizations strengthen their efforts to protect the public from harmful chemical exposures. These recommendations outline opportunities for progress in the following areas: prevention, monitoring, science, communities, public engagement, health professionals, and emergencies.

The Occupational Safety and Health Administration has announced in a **Notice of Proposed Rulemaking** an update and revision of two aspects of the agency's recordkeeping and reporting requirements for work-related injuries and illnesses. To educate employers and employees on the proposed changes, OSHA has updated its **Recordkeeping** Web page to include answers to **frequently asked questions** regarding the proposed rule. Nursing CNE Activities on Asthma Triggers

In conjunction with Dr. Helen Miner, Director of AHEC and Dr. Barbara Huggins from "Dose of Health" CBS 19, the Southwest Center for Pediatric Environmental Health developed two continuing education courses targeted toward school nurses.
